

2024 Crises
Highlights

Looking back at 2024—a year shaped by emerging emergencies, ongoing crises, and unimaginable challenges—one thing remained constant: your unwavering generosity. **Your compassion empowered UNHCR** to respond to some of the world's most urgent crises.



The ongoing commitment of our monthly donors enables us to respond within 48 hours when an emergency erupts, ensuring we are always ready to act swiftly and effectively in the face of future crises.

UNPRECEDENTED EMERGENCIES

This year, UNHCR managed 43 active emergencies across 25 countries, including 26 newly declared crises. Your support enabled us to provide immediate relief to families in desperate need. Below are some of the key emergencies we tackled together:

Afghanistan Floods

Due to decades of conflict, poverty, and natural disasters, 23.7 million people were already in need of humanitarian aid in the country. In March and April 2024, severe flooding caused widespread destruction, claiming over 300 lives, damaging or destroying 10,500 homes, and cutting off entire districts due to road damage.

Our Response:

Thanks to your timely support, UNHCR was on the ground immediately, deploying emergency tents and essential supplies, like blankets, kitchen sets, and hygiene kits.

We provided:



918 emergency tents.



Over 2,200 emergency supply kits.



Cash assistance to over 4,700 households to repair homes or cover rent.

Thanks to your generosity, the most vulnerable families received sustainable, disaster-resilient solutions when they needed it most.

Lebanon: Escalation of Hostilities

In September, Lebanon faced its deadliest attacks in decades. The intensified Israeli airstrikes displaced over 1.2 million people in just one month. Nearly 450,000 refugees and Lebanese nationals fled to Syria, straining local resources.

Our Response:

UNHCR rapidly scaled up its emergency response:



Delivered essential items to over 258,000 people, including mattresses and solar lamps.



Provided cash assistance to 453,000 individuals for shelter and basic needs.



Mobilized healthcare support, including 10 ambulances, 60 trauma kits, and emergency supplies for 100,000 people.

In Syria, your generosity ensured that over 250,000 people received emergency supplies, winter items, and food parcels.

Your kindness made all the difference to our efforts, and to their needs.



















Myanmar and the Rohingya Crisis

Fighting and natural disasters deepened the crisis in Myanmar, displacing over 3.5 million people. Refugee camps in Bangladesh faced severe flooding, exacerbating the hardship for Rohingya refugees.

Our Response:

Your donations meant UNHCR was able to:



Deliver essential supplies to 360,000 people in Myanmar.



Provide shelter assistance to 73,500 individuals.



Rebuild roads and infrastructure in Bangladesh to prevent further flooding.





Sudan: Deepening War

Sudan became the world's largest displacement crisis in 2024, with over 12.3 million people forced to flee. Food insecurity and disease outbreaks further compounded the suffering.

Our Response:

Inside Sudan, we focused on life-saving support, including water, sanitation, and protection services. In neighboring countries, we collaborated with host governments to ensure safe asylum and essential services for refugees.

Syria: A New Chapter

In December, the collapse of the Assad government displaced over 1.1 million people in less than a month. By year-end, over 486,000 internally displaced Syrians had returned to their homes.

Our Response:

Your contributions allowed us to:



Distribute emergency supplies, winter assistance, and protection services.



Support spontaneous returns and early recovery programs for displaced families.





As of December, 6.8 million Ukrainian refugees were recorded globally, with 14.6 million people inside Ukraine needing humanitarian assistance.

Our Response:

With your help, we provided:



Cash assistance to over 521,000 people.



Emergency shelter and essential items to 150,000 individuals.



Mental health and legal support to 610,000 people.
